Key Reminders:

- Contact: Our Home Education Link Officers
 (HELOs) will continue to offer yearly contact via
 your preferred method home visits, telephone
 and video calls, or written reports. This is a
 great chance to celebrate your child's progress.
- **EHC Plans**: if your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan, SEND colleagues will be arranging their statutory 'annual' reviews.
- **Health Services**: you can still access the *0–19 Public Health Nursing Service*, which supports all children's health needs in the community.



- **Exam Costs**: please remember EHE families remain responsible for all resources and fees.
- Thinking about EHE: speak with a HELO for impartial advice before making a final decision.

Learning Spotlight

We want to shine a light on the amazing learning journeys happening across Derbyshire's home educating community. This time, we're featuring a creative science project from an EHE family:

Growing Curiosity - Home Science Experiment:

Exploring biology by growing beans in different conditions – light, dark, and water-only. They tracked growth, made predictions, and created a chart to show their findings. A brilliant way to combine science, maths, and observation skills.



Learning Tip - Create a Learning Journal: Keeping a simple scrapbook of your child's learning can be a great way to reflect, celebrate progress, and build confidence. It doesn't need to be formal – photos, drawings and notes can work wonderfully.

FAQ & Guidance

Do I need to follow the National Curriculum?

No – not required, but your child should receive an education that is suitable to their age, ability, aptitude and any special educational needs.

Can I access support from the Local Authority?

Yes – our team is here to offer advice and guidance, happy to discuss every form of education.

Will someone contact us?

Yes – we offer annual contact to discuss your child's education – whichever way suits you best.

Can my child sit exams?

Yes – but you'll need to arrange this privately via exam centres and/or online providers.

What if I decide to return my child to school?

You can apply for a school place at any time - contact the Admissions Team for guidance.
